Eligibility for Free School Meals and other funding

We know that from time to time circumstances can change and you may find you become eligible for Free School Meals and subsequently Pupil Premium Funding.

Each year our school receives funding from the government called 'Pupil Premium for EACH CHILD registered and this enables us to provide vital extra resources to support those children and in turn, the whole school. This is calculated in October so if you think you could be eligible you should apply now. Should your child be eligible for free school meals you could save up to £400 a year on dinner money as well as a reduction on music fees and trips etc.

If your joint family income is under £16,190 per year and you receive any of the benefits listed below you may be eligible

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support from NASS (National Asylum Support Service) under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190
- · Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit.

New outdoor activities programme for schools at Warwickshire's Country Parks

Warwickshire's Country Parks have a new programme of 'hands on' outdoor activities, designed to encourage children to discover the natural world through a variety of habitats including meadows, woodland and ponds. Park Rangers welcome school visits from any Local Authority area, and have purpose-built education centres at Kingsbury Water Park and Ryton Pools Country Park; they also offer activities at Hartshill Hayes Country Park.

From bushcraft to minibeast hunts, pond dipping to den building, the curriculum-linked activities aim to reinforce:

Resilience – working in an unfamiliar environment, finding things that are new to you

Teamwork – looking after each other, recording information for your team, collaborative learning opportunities with specific roles

Independence – keeping safe, expanding your knowledge



The year 4 children were very lucky to receive individual dictionaries from the Warwick Rotary Club again this year.








Robinwood Residential Trip

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


