



Reception Round Up - Friday 15th November 2024



This week in Reception, the children have been thinking about 'Grandma' in the story 'Little Red Riding Hood'. They have been sharing photos of their own grandparents and talking about how special they are. During Wellie Walk, the children created maps of the school playground, which they could give to Little Red Riding Hood if she were to come to our school and to help her find her way around.

We have also started practising songs from our Christmas Show, which we can't wait to share with you. We are looking forward to seeing all the children in their Christmas costumes!



Next week in Reception...

Maths:

In Maths, the children will be continuing their learning on part-part-wholes. They will also be exploring the composition of numbers 3, 4 and 5 and will be using the Numberblocks to help them (1 and 2 make 3, 2 and 2 make 4, 1 and 3 make 4, 1 and 4 make 5, 2 and 3 make 5). The children will be creating Stampolines to show how these Numberblocks are composed.

Phonics:

In Phonics, the children will be learning 2 more sounds.



The sounds are:
'h' and 'b'



Please help your child find objects in your home or think of objects that begin with a 'ck' or an 'e'. Remember you can listen to these sounds on the videos on Seesaw.

Literacy, Understanding the World & Expressive Arts:

The children will be continuing to read the traditional fairy tale 'Little Red Riding Hood'. They will be exploring the characters in the story and the repetition it uses. The children will have the opportunity to create a collage of the characters from the story to support their retelling and understanding of the story.

We would love you to send in some photos of your child's grandparents to support our learning next week too. They can be actual photos or they can be uploaded to Seesaw.

How You Can Help...

- Encourage your child's independence by encouraging them to walk down from the top gate by themselves in the mornings. We are celebrating their independence with stickers from Mrs Hutchin as they enter the school.
- Share a book and read with your child every night.
- Talk with your child about their day at school.
- Encourage your child to become independent in using a knife and fork effectively.
- Encourage your child to be responsible for gathering their belongings in the morning and putting on their coats independently, to help them do so in school.

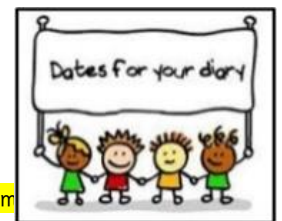

Other Information and Notices:

Show & Tell:

Each week, we have a 'Show & Tell' session. If your child would like to take part (they don't have to), please can they bring their 'Show & Tell' in on their class's chosen day. They can put it safely in our 'Show & Tell' boxes.

Cherry – Thursdays

Willow – Fridays

Toys:

Children are **not** allowed to bring in toys from home. We have lots of toys at school and we don't want your child to be upset if their own toys get lost at school.

P.E:

Cherry Class will have P.E. on **Tuesdays** and **Fridays**.

Willow Class will have P.E. on **Tuesdays** and **Thursdays**.

The children are allowed to wear any colour trainers and must wear their school jumper or cardigan.

Reading:

Last week, we sent out your child's first wordless (purple band) reading book. Please keep enjoying these books together at home. Towards the end of this Autumn half term, we will be sending home a worded book (pink book band), which your child will be able to read with you. **Please make sure these packets are in your child's bookbag every day, ready to read with us at any time.**

Water bottles:

Children must have a **named** water bottle in school every day.

Bookbags:

Letters and any crafts will be put in your child's bookbags so please check these **each night**. If you have any **letters or slips** to return to school/get to us then please do not put these in the bookbag, please give them directly to Mrs Nicol on the gate in the mornings.

Seesaw:

Don't forget to login into 'Seesaw' so you can see **some** of the things that the children are getting up to at school.

Spare clothes and wellies:

All children need to bring a pair of Wellies and a named bag with spare clothes in to leave in school.

Milk:

Please register for 'Cool Milk' if your child would like milk. From their 5th birthday you will have to pay for them to have milk.

Birthdays:

We have a special Birthday tradition at Emscote! The children are allowed to wear their own clothes to school on their birthday. It means that everyone can wish them a Happy Birthday! If your child's birthday is at the weekend or during a holiday then they can wear their own clothes on the nearest Monday/Friday.
