<b>Year 3</b>	Changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age	The achievements of the Ancient Egyptian Civilization	Local History – more recent history of school: Interview parents/grandparents – their experience of All Saints' school (sim/diff) Local area – street names, housing differences
<b>Year 4</b>	The achievements of the Ancient Greek civilization  The Roman Empire and its impact on Britain	Local History – Fire of Warwick and impact on the town	(Separate unit on comparison of communities in Warwick and Sierra Leone, link school)
<b>Year 5</b>	Britain's settlement by the Anglo-Saxons	The impact of Viking settlement in Britain and the struggle between Anglo-Saxons and Vikings for power.	Life in Britain during Tudor times, with a focus on Tudor Warwick.
<b>Year 6</b>	Aspect of British History - The impact and legacy of the Victorian era (including the history of All Saints' church and school and aspects of the British Empire).	Aspect of British History - World War II – including the impact of the Coventry blitz (as we are part of the Coventry Diocese); linked with Peace and Reconciliation as a Cross of Nails school.	A depth study of a non-European society contrasting with a period of British History: Early Islamic civilization/Golden Age of Islam Compared and contrasted with the 'Dark Ages' when Britain was settled by Vikings and Anglo-Saxons.
