
Second Hand Uniform

'Young Green Shoots' Competition

Warwickshire County Council is inviting school pupils in Coventry and Warwickshire aged between 4 and 19 to submit their ideas on what it means to be a climate change hero as part of the Young Green Shoots competition.

To apply, pupils must answer the following question:

What does being a climate hero mean to you?

Climate heroes do both big and small things, from planting a huge forest to turning off the lights when they aren't needed. And anyone can be a climate hero – it could be somebody famous, a government, a business leader, a local council, or it could even be you! Show or tell us how your hero will protect the environment and fight climate change.

Submissions can either be a short piece of writing or a drawing by the deadline of **27 February**. Please submit the work by emailing **childfriendly@warwickshire.gov.uk** with name, age, school's name and address.

Prizes

One winner from each of four age categories will receive £2,500 in funding from Warwickshire County Council's Green Shoots Community Fund for their school or college to spend on climate change related projects.

The winners and runners-up in each category will also have their work showcased at the forthcoming Coventry & Warwickshire Climate Change Summit, to be held at the University of Warwick in March. This event will bring together the key public sector organisations from across Coventry & Warwickshire, alongside representatives from the private, voluntary and community sectors, to declare a united commitment to fight climate change and to further develop and align the plans to reach net zero by 2050 or sooner.

Coventry and Warwickshire Youth Orchestra are delighted to be able to give you details of their next concert, Celebrating Coventry: From Strauss to the Specials, on Sunday 13th March at 2.30 pm at the Burgess Hall, King Henry VIII School, Warwick Road, Coventry CV3 6AQ. Tickets cost £8 for adults, £6 seniors and £4 for under 18s and can be purchased online at Celebrating Coventry: a Concert of Popular Classics - Coventry UK City of Culture 2021 (coventry2021.co.uk). A limited number of tickets will also be available on the door.

Young people interested in joining the orchestra can attend the concert **free of charge** by emailing cwyorch@gmail.com and a ticket will be reserved for them. The audience will recognise well known themes from The Specials and Dr Who in a specially commissioned piece of work written by Trevor Wilson to celebrate Coventry City of Culture and CWYO's 60th anniversary. The development of this piece has been supported by the orchestra's patron, Lynval Golding of The Specials, and has the stamp of approval from the band, with Horace Panter of The Specials, saying: "I'm delighted that the melodies of Ghost Town have been sampled so imaginatively in this new piece. I wish the CWYO all the very best of luck!" The audience will also enjoy popular classics, including Bizet's Carmen, Beethoven's Egmont, Dvorak's Slavonic Dance and Strauss' Emperor Waltz.

The 40 strong orchestra is led by conductor Tony Ayres and is made up of young people from the Coventry, Warwickshire and Solihull areas who play at Grade 5 level or above. It provides an invaluable opportunity for young players to enjoy rehearsing and performing together.

CWYO kept rehearsals going online over lockdown but were overjoyed to be able to return to face to face rehearsals last September, at their new home at Coventry University's Ellen Terry building. Their first performance in nearly two years was last Christmas, in Coventry's iconic cathedral, as part of the NSPCC Christmas concert, where they performed to great acclaim. They are keen to showcase their progress and attract new players.

The March concert will be a fantastic experience for families, aspiring musicians and music lovers alike.


