## Nature of support 2011/12

#### Small groups support

#### **Emscote Infant School**

Children eligible for PPG are identified and monitored as a vulnerable group. A termly pupil progress meetings these children were discussed and needs were identified and a plan made.

Children in each year group have withdrawn support, led by a teaching assistant, but planned by a teacher, on areas that are holding them back academically. This monitored regularly and planning is changed to meet need.

Other ways that the grant has been spent: Additional reading sessions Maths booster sessions

We also ensure that children in receipt of this grant attend at least one extra curriculum session.

PPG was also used to fund additional support in the classes.

## Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2011/12

#### **Emscote Infant School**

To raise self- esteem and confidence in individual pupils. To support children in reading, writing and maths.

### Measuring the impact of PPG spending

The school will evaluate the impact on each pupil at the end each term. Evaluation will focus on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the intervention.

The ultimate aim is for there to be no gap between children claiming FSM and those that don't.

Nature of Support 2012/13

Emscote Infant School – our aim is to close the academic gap and enrich.

Children eligible for PPG are identified and monitored as a vulnerable group. A termly pupil progress meetings these children were discussed and needs were identified and a plan made.

Children in each year group have withdrawn support, by a teacher, on areas that are holding them back academically. This monitored regularly and planning is changed to meet need.

Other ways that the grant has been spent:

- Additional reading sessions (informed by monthly tracking of how much children read at home)
- Maths booster sessions
- Numeracy advancement for the high flyers that are eligible for PPG.
- Counselling
- Nurture a group
- One to one nurture session, and most importantly for the staff member to feed back into social services meetings.
- Small group tuition, an example of this is pre teaching vocabulary.
- Access to all paid for after school clubs.
- When appropriate we have also funded Scallywags Kids club in the holiday.

We also ensure that children in receipt of this grant attend *at least one* extra curriculum session. We use some funding to pay for children to participate in afterschool Spanish.

PPG was also used to fund additional support in the classes.
