Year 6 Autumn Term Overview 2024



Dear Parents.

We hope that you have had a wonderful summer! We are delighted to be back teaching your children again this year. They have settled in to Year 6 brilliantly and we can't wait for lots more fun, learning and adventures this year! ENGLISH

We will be beginning Autumn term by 'going back to basics' to ensure the children are secure with the fundamentals of literacy. This means we will spend a large amount of time working



on handwriting, spelling, grammar, oracy and punctuation. Following that, this term, our English work will be based on the texts: Holes by Louis Sachar and When Stars Are Scattered by Victoria Jamieson. The text types we will study are: narrative writing (with flashbacks), persuasion, non-chronological reports and free verse poetry.

SCIENCE For the first half term, our topic will be Light. During this topic, children will learn about: how light travels, how

shadows are formed and how the human eye works. In the second half term, our topic will be *Classification*. Children will look at the systems for classifying living things.

COMPUTING

Children will be revisiting how a computer saves files and will be managing their own area of our school network. They will look at the benefits and drawbacks of tagging photos with location information and discuss internet safety. Children will have to evaluate different apps and work to design one.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

We will begin the term by revisiting our Christian ethos of 'Working Together, Valuing Everyone, Learning For life'. We explore this through the parable of the Good Samaritan.



Following this, we will look at an Understanding Christianity unit called Creation and Science, which explores the relationship between the accounts of creation in Genesis and contemporary scientific accounts.

PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND HEALTH EDUCATION

In PSHE sessions, we will revise the Zones of Regulation, follow the scheme Heartsmart (in which children will learn how to maintain positive mental health) and do some St John's Ambulance lessons on calling for help and choking.

MATHEMATICS

Children will be covering a range of: place value understanding, mental and written calculation strategies, data handling, shape, measure and problem solving.

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Each week, the children will work on using and applying skills through investigations and reasoning activities. There will continue to be a strong focus on ensuring quick recall of times table facts.

Geography: Our Changing World History: The Victorians

For the first half term, we will be doing a Geography topic - Our Changing World, where

children will strengthen their understanding of the world, how it has changed over time and will consider what it may look like in the future.



In the second half term, we will do a History topic -The Victorians, where children will study the life and impact of the Victorian era. They will also learn about the impact of the British Empire.

MUSIC

During Autumn term, children will have the opportunity to continue learning with Jeremy Dibb from 'Warwick a Singing Town', in addition to following learning through the 'Charanga' scheme of music. As well as this, we will be focusing on a unit of Rap, linking English poetry work with Music. They will learn to recognise and keep a beat and rhythm.

FRENCH

Children will be studying French again this year. They will: revise previous years' learning. They will also learn and revise number, ages and years. We work mostly on correct pronunciation and learning of the language. However, children will also have the opportunity to write some simple French sentences.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

For the first half term, PE will be on a Monday (this will be a double session as it is a full afternoon of PE taught by Mr Thorne). Please ensure children are sent in wearing PE kit on this day. This half term, we will focus on a selection of invasion games - such as: Tchoukball, Tag-Rugby and Disc Golf. Through these games, children will develop their attack, defence and passing skills.
